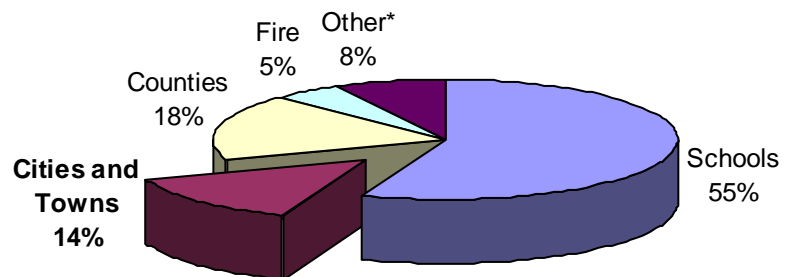


YOUR Property Tax Dollar Serving YOU

Where does your property tax dollar go?

For every dollar you pay in property taxes, the City of Anytown receives an average of 14% of your total property taxes. The rest goes to schools, the county, fire, and districts like regional library, park and recreation, emergency medical and hospital, and any other agencies listed on your tax bill.

The City of Anytown receives 14% of your property tax dollar



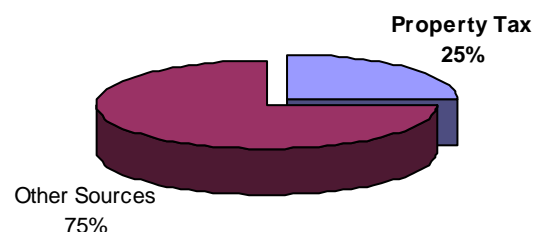

How much of the city's budget is supported by my property taxes?

The city's general fund receives about \$2.5 million in property taxes, accounting for approximately 25% of the total general fund revenue.

The general fund pays for services that generally benefit the entire community, like police and fire, parks and recreation, libraries, streets and sidewalks, economic development and community planning, and general government services.

How does the city make up the difference between what your services costs and how much property tax is received?

The City of Anytown also receives revenue from sales taxes, fees and service charges, grants, business and occupation taxes and hotel/motel taxes. Water, stormwater, sewer and solid waste are funded separately, through a user rate.
